



Adverbs tell more about a verb.

An adverb can tell more about a verb by telling how an action is done. Adverbs that tell how usually end in *-ly*.

Examples:

Hunter listened *carefully* to the rules.

Heaven ran *quickly* down the street.

Maggie sat *quietly* during the movie.

The wind blew *wildly*.

*Suddenly* the lights went out.

Allison *eagerly* awaited the announcement.

Cyle *gently* touched the puppy.
